April 16, 2020 Quorum Court Minutes

Justices Cline, Forrest, Longmire, Percy, Rogers, and Tennison were present in the basement of the Annex on 511 Union. Justices Cook, Couch, Noel, Pasmore, Price, and Williams were present in the parking lot of 511 Union via Zoom Conference. Justice Weinstock was present via Zoom Conference.

Judge Day called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

The first order of business was the approval of the meeting's minutes from March 23, 2020. Justice Cline made a motion to approve and Justice Pasmore seconded.

Old Business: The first order of old business was the second reading of the Ordinance to amend Ordinance 2014-3, incorporating a policy for exempt employee leave requirements. Justice Cline made a motion to read by title only. Justice Rogers seconded. The Deputy Clerk read the Ordinance. There was no discussion.

The second order of old business was the tabled Ordinance, Ordinance to adopt Johanson Group classification and compensation study. The Ordinance will continue to be tabled during the Covid-19 pandemic. There was no further discussion.

New Business: No new business to discuss.

Announcements: Judge Day stated that it has been an interesting three weeks, but he is proud of Craighead County for social distancing and following the CDC guidelines. Judge Day also stated he is very supportive of opening the economy up when that time comes. He also reminded everyone to wash their hands anytime possible and to wear their masks.

Public Comment: Justice Forrest asked if there was any knowledge regarding the death of a Craighead County citizen who tested positive for Covid-19. Judge Day informed the Court that from an official standpoint the only details he was provided is that the individual was of 65 years of age or older. Judge Day then said that he did hear the individual was in the hospital with underlying medical conditions.

With no further discussion, Justice Forrest made a motion to adjourn to committee meetings. Justice Percy seconded. Judge Day adjourned the full court meeting at 5:38 p.m.
